

This report contains the results of the 2023 Dental Hygienist Workforce survey. More than 5,500 dental hygienists voluntarily participated in this survey. The Virginia Department of Health Professions' Healthcare Workforce Data Center (HWDC) administers the survey during the license renewal process, which takes place annually on an ongoing basis during the birth month of each dental hygienist. These survey respondents represent 88% of the 6,304 dental hygienists who are licensed in the state and 94% of renewing practitioners.

The HWDC estimates that 5,259 dental hygienists participated in Virginia's workforce during the survey time period, which is defined as those who worked at least a portion of the year in the state or who live in the state and intend to return to work in the profession at some point in the future. Virginia's dental hygienist workforce provided 3,322 "full-time equivalency units," which the HWDC defines simply as working 2,000 hours per year.

The median age of Virginia's dental hygienist workforce is 43, and 98% of all dental hygienists in the state are female. In a random encounter between two dental hygienists, there is a 40% chance that they would be of different races or ethnicities, a measure known as the diversity index. For dental hygienists who are under the age of 40, this diversity index increases to 45%. This makes Virginia's dental hygienist workforce less diverse than the state's overall population, which has a comparable diversity index of 60%. More than one-third of all dental hygienists grew up in a rural area, and 22% of dental hygienists who grew up in a rural area currently work in a non-metro area of Virginia. In total, 10% of all dental hygienists work in a non-metro area of the state.

Among all dental hygienists, 90% are currently employed in the profession, 57% have one full-time position, and 54% work between 30 and 39 hours per week. The typical dental hygienist earns between \$60,000 and \$70,000 per year. In addition, more than three out of every four dental hygienists receive at least one employer-sponsored benefit, including 55% who have access to a retirement plan. Among all dental hygienists, 95% indicated that they are satisfied with their current work situation, including 62% who indicated that they are "very satisfied."

Summary of Trends

In this section, all statistics for the current year are compared to the 2013 dental hygienist workforce. The number of licensed dental hygienists in Virginia has increased by 16% (6,304 vs. 5,425). At the same time, the size of the dental hygienist workforce has risen by 17% (5,259 vs. 4,496), and the number of FTEs provided by this workforce has grown by 8% (3,322 vs. 3,062). Virginia's renewing dental hygienists are more likely to respond to this survey (94% vs. 88%).

While the median age of Virginia's dental hygienist workforce has fallen slightly (43 vs. 44), the percentage of all dental hygienists who are female has remained constant (98%). The diversity index of this workforce has increased (40% vs. 29%), a trend that has also occurred among dental hygienists who are under the age of 40 (45% vs. 39%). Dental hygienists are more likely to have grown up in a rural area (36% vs. 34%), and dental hygienists who grew up in a rural area are also more likely to work in a non-metro area of Virginia (22% vs. 19%). In total, the percentage of all dental hygienists who work in a non-metro area of the state has increased slightly (10% vs. 9%).

Dental hygienists are more likely to hold one full-time position (57% vs. 47%) instead of two more positions simultaneously (12% vs. 17%). In addition, dental hygienists are more likely to work between 30 and 39 hours per week (54% vs. 47%) instead of between 20 and 29 hours per week (15% vs. 20%), and the percentage of dental hygienists who have worked at their primary work location for more than two years has fallen (57% vs. 69%). The one-year rates of underemployment (4% vs. 12%) and involuntary unemployment (1% vs. 4%) have both fallen. Dental hygienists are considerably more likely to be employed in a solo practice (69% vs. 53%) instead of a group practice (17% vs. 39%).

The median annual income of the dental hygienist workforce has increased (\$60k-\$70k vs. \$50k-\$55k), and dental hygienists are more likely to earn this income as an hourly wage (83% vs. 74%) instead of as a salary (16% vs. 23%). Although dental hygienists are more likely to indicate that they are satisfied with their current work situation (95% vs. 92%), they are slightly less likely to indicate that they are "very satisfied" (62% vs. 63%).



- **2. Full-Time Equivalency Unit (FTE):** The HWDC uses 2,000 (40 hours for 50 weeks) as its baseline measure for FTEs.
- **3.** Licensees in VA Workforce: The proportion of licensees in Virginia's Workforce.
- **4. Licensees per FTE:** An indication of the number of licensees needed to create 1 FTE. Higher numbers indicate lower licensee participation.
- 5. Workers per FTE: An indication of the number of workers in Virginia's workforce needed to create 1 FTE. Higher numbers indicate lower utilization of available workers.




