
Trends in Dentistry Licensees and Workforce



In 2022, 2% drop in total licensees and workforce




6% drop in FTEs in 2022











Overall, VA dentistry workforce appears adequate relative to national numbers



5,720 dentists worked in VA in 2022; 2.6% of 202,536 nationally








Trends in Dental Hygienist Licensees and Workforce



Since 2013, increases in licensees, workforce, and FTEs




18%, 17%, and 12% increase in licensees, workforce, and FTEs















5,290 dental hygienists (2.8% of 187,000 nationally) and 46 dental assistants II worked in VA in 2022












Median age is stable










Virginia has more hygienists in the youngest and oldest ages groups




Median age is declining

























2013 versus 2022 Dentist Population Pyramid












2013 versus 2022

Trends in Income and Debt: Dentists




Median income stable since 2018

Trends in Income and Debt: Dental Hygienists




Median income has been stable since 2020

Decreasing % of dental hygienists under 40 with



















Geographic Distribution: Dentists




Highest concentration is in Northern VA














Geographic Distribution: Dental Hygienists



Highest number is in Northern VA











Highest concentration per capita is in Hampton Roads



























































































Conclusion



Access to dental workforce in Virginia is similar to US although VA workforce is slightly older



Dental hygienists and dentists are concentrated in different areas of the state
